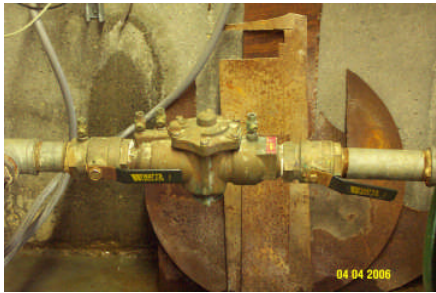

# FORCED HOT WATER HEATING SYSTEMS NEED SPECIAL CARE!!

**Boilers that have automatic water feeders need to be protected so that the culinary water system does not become contaminated from the boiler**



**REDUCED PRESSURE ZONE  
BACKFLOW ASSEMBLY**

The plumbing code adopted by the State of Utah requires that any potential cross connection between the drinking water and any other non potable source be prevented or protected

## Where do I Begin?

Identifying the "degree of hazard" helps to determine what type of protection is needed. Your local water utility is happy to answer any questions you may have.

A licensed plumber should install the assembly you choose to insure correct installation occurs.

## What To Do to Prevent Cross Connections.

## How To Prevent Cross Connections

By installing Backflow prevention Assemblies on identified potential hazards we can all protect the drinking water supply from ill effects that could affect your health or safety

We all have a responsibility to ourself and to others to strive to maintain a safe uncontaminated drinking water system. We thank you for your cooperation in advance.



Heating systems in many homes have automatic water feeders to keep the boiler full. These feeders if left unprotected can create a condition known as backpressure where the pressure in the boiler is higher than the water system pressure and can cause the boiler water to be introduced into the culinary system. This can cause drinking water quality problems in your home and possibly the entire water system!

Installing a backflow prevention assembly and making sure to have it tested annually to insure proper operation will help to reduce or eliminate cross connection incidents
